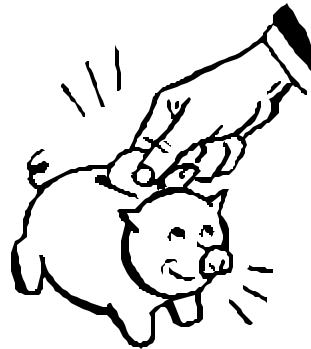

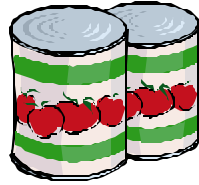
Penny Jar:

Campbell's Soup labels:

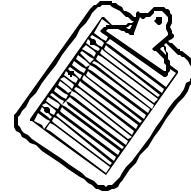
